## Manitoba Small Claims Court Checklist — Appealing the Decision

## If you Appeared at the Hearing

	Prepare and file a Notice of Appeal ( <b>Form 76H</b> ) within 30 days from the date on the
	Certificate of Decision. The cost to file a Notice of Appeal is \$35.
	Deliver the Notice of Appeal to the other party within 20 days of filing.
	Please review <b>Service of Documents</b> for detailed information on how to serve the
	Notice of Appeal.
	File a Declaration of Service ( <b>Form 76B</b> ) at least 10 days before the hearing.
	See <u>Preparing for the Hearing</u> and <u>At the Hearing</u> for tips on how to present information to a judge.
	Consider any new or additional evidence you may wish to present at the appeal hearing.
If you did not Appear at the Hearing	
	If you did not appear at the Small Claim hearing before a Court Officer, you must first ask a judge of the Court of Queen's Bench for leave, or permission, to appeal.
	Prepare and file an Application for Leave to Appeal and Notice of Appeal (Form 76I)
	within 30 days of the date on the Certificate of Decision.  At the time that you file an Application for Leave to Appeal and Notice of Appeal and pay
	the \$35 filing fee, you must also pay security for costs of \$150 in guaranteed funds
	(certified cheque or money order).
	Deliver the Application for Leave to Appeal and Notice of Appeal to the other party
	within 20 days of filing.
	Please review <b>Service of Documents</b> for detailed information on how to serve the Application for Leave to Appeal and Notice of Appeal.
	File a Declaration of Service ( <b>Form 76B</b> ) at least 10 days before the hearing.
	If leave to appeal is granted, the appeal hearing may proceed on the same day.
	See <u>Preparing for the Hearing</u> and <u>At the Hearing</u> for tips on how to present
	information to the judge.
<b>NOTE:</b> You should address the judge as "My Lord" or "My Lady".	
Appe	al to the Manitoba Court of Appeal
	If you are unsuccessful in your Small Claim appeal before a judge of the Court of
	Queen's Bench, you may consider a further appeal to the Manitoba Court of Appeal, but
_	it can only be taken on a question of law.
	You must ask for leave, or permission, of the Court to Appeal to file your appeal. You
	may wish to have the assistance of a lawyer.  For further information on the Court of Appeal process, please see
