

Justice Diana Cameron

Justice Cameron was appointed to the Manitoba Court of Appeal on November 2, 2012, after having previously served on the Manitoba Court of Queen's Bench since February 3, 2011.

Born in Manitoba, she received her B.A. (Distinction) and L.L.B. from the University of Manitoba. She was admitted to the Manitoba Bar in 1989.

Prior to her appointment to the Bench, Justice Cameron was a Senior Crown Attorney with the Prosecution Service, Manitoba Justice, where she had worked for most of her career. From 2004 to 2010, she was Crown Counsel for the Constitutional Law Branch, Civil Legal Services, Manitoba Justice.

Between 2015 and 2022, she served as the Judicial Nominee and Chair of the Federal Judicial Advisory Committee for Manitoba. In 2021, she was appointed Chair of the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Manitoba, which finalized its report and recommendation for the federal electoral districts redistribution in 2023. She has been a member of the Canadian Chapter of the International Association of Women Judges since 2016, serving as its President between 2022 and 2024. In addition, Justice Cameron has served in many roles for the Manitoba Bar Association.

Prior to her appointment to the Court of Queen's Bench, Justice Cameron had been the Vice-Chair for the Liberty Local of the Manitoba Metis Federation, on the Board of Directors for Teen Touch Manitoba and a volunteer for the Winnipeg Humane Society.
