RE: COURT ATTIRE

At a recent meeting of the Bench, the following policy with respect to the wearing of formal court attire in the Court of Queen's Bench was adopted. **This notice replaces a notice issued February 10, 2017.**

I would ask counsel appearing before the Court to take note of when they are required to wear formal court attire. Formal court attire (Gown) includes a gown, waistcoat, shirt and tabs.

Summary Conviction Appeals Gown

Small Claims Appeals Gown

Chambers, including pre-trials, case No Gown

Motions, pre-trials, case conferences No Gown

Counsel may depart from strict attire requirements to the extent necessary by reason of maternity. Counsel may also depart from strict attire requirements by reason of disability. Modified courtroom attire should be dark in colour and in keeping with the spirit of this notice and court decorum. Counsel may, before the opening of court, advise the court clerk orally, or by note, that they are in modified court attire in accordance with this Notice.

**In cases where the uncontested divorce follows immediately from a resolution arising as a result of a pre-trial settlement proceeding, whether a case management or pre-trial, and the judge hearing the matter proceeds to an immediate uncontested divorce, the wearing of a gown may be dispensed with; similarly, while on circuit where the uncontested divorce hearing occurs as part of a list of unrelated matters which would render it inconvenient for proceedings to be adjourned. If, on the other hand, the uncontested divorce is part of a list of such matters, then a gown will be required.

If counsel are unsure, they may speak to the clerk who will obtain instructions from the presiding judge.
