MANITOBA COURT OF APPEAL

RE: ALL HEARINGS AT THE COURT OF APPEAL WILL BE CONDUCTED REMOTELY UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

This Notice replaces the previously issued Notice dated August 10, 2021, which stated that all appeals, motions or applications were to be heard in person, unless ordered otherwise.

The Manitoba Court of Appeal continues to balance its institutional obligations with broader public health priorities. Recently, the Chief Public Health Officer of Manitoba released preliminary modelling that suggests that the number of daily COVID-19 cases could quadruple as the Omicron variant spreads. As a result, and until further notice, starting on Tuesday, January 4, 2022:

- 1) all appeals will be heard remotely by videoconference; and
- 2) all motions or applications will be heard remotely by teleconference.

For in-custody criminal appeal, motion or application hearings, special procedures are required in order to ensure that the accused can participate in the hearing. Unless the accused's presence is waived, counsel for the accused will be required to attend Courtroom 330 in person with their webcam-equipped laptop. An internet feed has been set up in Courtroom 330 that allows counsel for the accused to access the videoconference. A sheriff will bring the accused into Courtroom 330. The only other persons that will be allowed in the courtroom, other than the accused, counsel for the accused, the sheriff and the court clerk, will be members of the press who will be in the gallery. Social distancing measures are compulsory.

How to access a videoconference appeal hearing: Half an hour before the hearing, the Court Clerk will send out a videoconference hearing email invitation from GoToWebinar to all counsel or self-represented litigants with a link to join the

videoconference. All counsel or self-represented litigants are required to access the videoconferencing link using a webcam-equipped computer 10 minutes before the hearing.

How to access a teleconference motion or application hearing: At least 24 hours prior to the hearing, the Court Clerk will provide counsel or self-represented litigants with a telephone number and access code. All counsel or self-represented litigants are required to access the teleconference line five minutes before the hearing.

If you are not familiar with videoconferencing or teleconferencing technology, please contact the Registry at least 24 hours before the hearing with any questions you may have.

The registry remains open for filings. With respect to the filing of documents, all previously announced public safety measures remain in place. Everyone is asked to respect these measures.
